I, Gil DeLuna, hereby issue this citation solely in my official capacity as Acting Bureau Chief of the Professional Fiduciaries Bureau of California, hereinafter referred to as the "Bureau."

License History:

The records of the Bureau show that license number PF230 was issued to you, M. Terry Campbell on October 24, 2008 and expired on October 31, 2011.

Citation:

A citation is hereby issued to you in accordance with section 125.9 and 6580(b)(1) of the Business and Professions Code for the violations(s) described below.

Cause for Violation:

Cause exhibits under Section 6530(a) of the Business and Professions Code (B&P) to issue a citation for exhibiting a willful violation of duty related to the practice of a professional fiduciary based on the following conduct:

Violation:

Section 6531 of the B&P provides that no professional fiduciary shall operate with an expired, suspended, or revoked license. On or about December 13, 2011, February 2, 2012, February 1, 2013, and February 4, 2013, the Bureau requested you provide our office with your Annual Statement that was due on or before September 1, 2011. The Bureau did not receive your Annual Statement until February 12, 2013.

1. As you reported on your Annual Statement, as of February 12, 2013 you have four conservatorships and six trusts that remain open. This is in violation of the number of clients you may have without being licensed by the Bureau as per Section 6501(f)(1) & (2) of the B&P. Therefore, you are operating as a Professional Fiduciary with an expired license.

Order of Abatement and Corrective Action:

The Bureau hereby directs that you immediately take action as may be necessary to achieve full compliance with all provisions of the Professional Fiduciaries Law and regulations adopted by the Bureau.

Unless you are contesting the citation, failure to abate the violation charged within 30 days of the date of your receipt of this document may be deemed to constitute a violation of the Professional Fiduciaries Act. Failure to comply may result in disciplinary action being taken by the Bureau or other appropriate judicial relief being taken against you.

Fine:

The Bureau is authorized to issue citations containing orders of abatement and/or administrative fines pursuant to Sections 125.9 or 6580(b)(1) of the Business and Professions Code against a professional fiduciary who has committed any acts or omissions which are in violation of the Act or the regulations contained in Division 41, Title 16, California Code of Regulations.

The fine for the violation is \$2,500.00

Payment of the administrative fine, if any and abatement will be considered satisfactory resolution of the violation(s) cited.

The citation will become a final order of the Bureau 30 days after the date of issuance of the citation. Payment must be made by cashier's check or money order only, payable to the Professional Fiduciaries Bureau. A personal or business check will not be accepted. Please indicate the citation number on the cashier's check or money order and mail it to the Bureau at 1625 North Market Blvd., Suite S-209, Sacramento, CA 95834.

Appeal of Citation:


If you desire a hearing to contest the finding of the violation, the request must be made in writing within thirty (30) days of the issuance of this citation.

In addition to requesting an administrative hearing as provided for in subdivision (b)(4) of Section 125.9 of the Business and Professions Code, you may request an informal conference to review the acts charged in the citation. Your request for an informal conference must be made in writing, within ten (10) days after the issuance of the citation. If the conference is requested, the Bureau will hold the conference within sixty (60) days from the receipt of your request.

At the conclusion of the informal conference, the Bureau may affirm, modify or dismiss your citation, including any fine levied or order of abatement issued. The Bureau will issue a written decision explaining the reasons for its action. The decision will be deemed to be a final order of the Bureau with regard to the citation issued; including any administrative fine levied or order of abatement.

If the citation, including any fine levied or order of abatement, is modified, the citation originally issued shall be considered withdrawn and a new citation issued. If you desire a formal administrative hearing to contest the new citation or to contest the Bureau's affirmation of the citation, you must make a new request in writing, within thirty (30) days of receipt of the informal conference decision, to the Bureau. The formal administrative hearing will be conducted as provided for in subdivision (b)(4) of Section 125.9. You may not request an informal conference for a citation which has been modified following an informal conference.

If a hearing is not requested, payment of any fine will not constitute an admission of the violation charged. Issuance of a citation is subject to public disclosure. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, if a fine is paid to satisfy an assessment based on the finding of a violation, payment of the fine will be represented as a satisfactory resolution of the matter for purposes of public disclosure. **Where a citation is not contested and a fine is not paid, the full amount of the assessed fine shall be added to the fee for renewal of the license. A license shall not be renewed without payment of the renewal fee in accordance with the Business and Professions Code Section 125.9.**
